Here are some ideas about how you could celebrate your achievements:

School Zone

Green Ambassador yearbook

Make a yearbook recording your achievements. You could create one as a team and make a copy for each member. Use the template on School Zone to help you get started.

Green Ambassadors party

Organise a party for all the members of your Green Team to celebrate the great work that you've done. You could also invite other VIPs, such as the head teacher and school governors, and give a presentation about your work. You could even do a tour to show off all the changes you've made.

Timeline

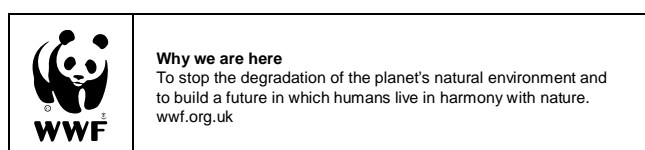
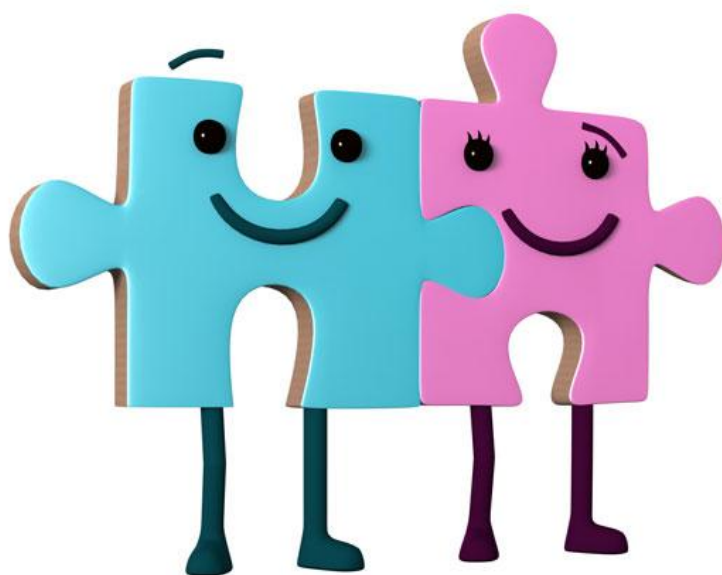
Use a corridor to make a timeline that shows the progress your team have made over the year. Split it into separate sections for each month and add photos or make drawings to show what has happened that month.
