

HOW TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Your mission is to make your school as green as possible. Follow these five steps to making effective changes in your school.

Take a leaf out of the Green Team's book and work as a team to develop your skills and help your school protect the planet.

Recognise your strengths and know your stuff

- Think about what you are good at, look at the skills section in your individual kit to help you.
- Ask for help when you need it, your team kit will give you guidance on page 12.
- Get to know your stuff so you can tell others about it, look at 'The green stuff' and 'Caring for the planet' in your team kit.

Investigate

- Use the surveys from School Zone to find out what's already happening within your school, look at the 'Caring for your planet section in the Team kit to suggest some issue you could look at.
- Talk to people in the school about where they think changed could be made.
- Tell the school what your team have discovered in an assembly. You could use the Green Ambassadors animation to help you schoolzone.wwf.org.uk/gafilm.

Make a plan

- Assess the results of your survey and conversations, and decide what issue to work on.
- Come up with lots of ideas for what you could do to tackle the issue. The stories on School Zone will show you how other schools tackled the issues.
- Make a plan the 'POPSTAR' approach on page 7 in your Team Kit will help you. Be ambitious but also think about what you can achieve.

Spread the word and celebrate success

Tell everyone about your fantastic work. This could include the rest of the class or school, parents, the local paper, or people living near the school.
