

## **OWL PLASTIC BOTTLE LANTERN**

## What you need

- Scissors or scalpel for tricky bits under adult supervision
- Brown acrylic paint
- Decorative pens in gold, silver and while
- LED tealight.
- Marker pen

## What to do

- 1. Cut the top off the bottle so 3/4 of the bottle remains
- Using a marker pen, draw an image of an owl – include wings, eyes, breast feathers and brow feathers. You can use our drawing to help you!

Top Tip

Why not re-use you owl as a pen pot after Earth Hour, until next year of course!

- 3. Cut out some of these shapes to have points where the light can shine through. For example the eyes, breast feathers and beak.
- 4. Paint with either white or brown acrylic paint or poster paints mixed with PVA Glue to help the paint stick to the plastic surface. Leave to dry.
- 5. Decorate with décor pens which work well on plastic.
- 6. Place an LED tealigh inside and light up on the 25th March to celebrate Earth Hour.


