

# **MAKE AN EARTH HOUR WISHING WAND**

#### What you need

- Cardboard from recycled packaging such as cereal boxes
- Small piece of recycled acetate or packaging film
- Colouring pens
- Scissors & glue
- A recycled paper art straw to make the wand


#### What to do

- Draw and cut out two 1. identical star shapes.
- On both stars, draw 2. a line 1cm in from the edge and cut it out, removing the middle of the stars.
- Cut out a piece of recycled acetate or packaging 3. film the same size as the star.
- Glue together the two star shapes with the 4. recycled acetate placed in the middle.
- Decorate the cardboard with colourful pens 5. and patterns.
- Think about something you care about and want 6. to protect. Draw your design onto the acetate.
- Use a paper art straw or tightly roll up a piece of 7. paper to make a wand. Stick to the back of the star.
- Write your promise for the planet around the 8. edge of the star or add paper streamers with your message.
