## **Instructions**

- 1. Look through an old magazine and rip out pages which have bright colours or patterns that appeal to you.
  - 2. Once you have collected a pile of colourful paper, research plants and flowers that are found in tropical rainforests. Carefully cut out these shapes. You may want to draw pencil guides first.
    - 3. Arrange the shapes on the cardboard and when you are happy with your design stick them down. You could add folds into some of the shapes to create a 3-D effect.
      - 4. Add your own drawings of rainforest animals to complete the image.
