What you'll need

- · Wildflower seeds
- Paprika
- Clay soil
- Compost
- Soil water

What to do

- 1. You can help to spread butterfly and bee friendly wildflowers throughout your local area with these exciting seed bombs.
- 2. Collect one or two buckets of clay-rich soil, compost and water.
- 3. Take some clay rich soil and some compost, wet them slightly and knead them until they start to bind together.
- 4. Add a sprinkle of seeds and a little paprika (to stop birds from eating them) and roll everything into a ball.
- 5. Leave the seed bombs to dry for a few days and then place them somewhere you would like flowers to grow.
- 6. When the conditions are right your seed bombs will start to grow!
