

WWF WILD WORLD HEROES BOOK REVIEW COMPETITION

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. WWF-UK is offering the chance to win a WWF animal adoption and copy of Our Planet by Matt Whyman for your school to promote our partnership on the 2021 Summer Reading Challenge. The competition is for primary school students (age 4-11) to review a nature or environment themed book and for their teachers to send these into us at <u>education@wwf.org.uk</u>. Three students will be chosen as the winners.
- 2. The competition is open to UK schools only. Teachers should enter the competition on behalf of their students using a valid school email address.
- 3. The competition opens on Friday 24 June 2021 and closes on Monday 20 September 2021 at 5pm. Any entries received after this time will not be considered.
- 4. To enter the competition, teachers are required to <u>submit this form</u> with any entries.
- 5. Any contact details supplied will be used for administering the competition and otherwise in accordance with WWF's data protection policy which can be found at <u>https://www.wwf.org.uk/privacy-and-data-protection.</u>
- 6. WWF-UK accepts no responsibility for late entries, or entries that are lost, mislaid, damaged, or delayed in transit, regardless of cause including as a result of equipment failure, technical malfunction, systems, satellite, network, server or computer hardware or software failure of any kind. Proof of sending does not qualify as proof of receipt.
- 7. All valid entries received will be judged by the Education Team and three schools will be chosen as the winners.
- 8. The three selected schools will be notified by email by 5pm on 25 September 2021. If a selected school cannot be contacted after reasonable attempts have been made, WWF-UK reserves the right to offer the WWF animal adoption prize to another school.
- 9. The prize is non-transferrable and cannot be exchanged for the cash equivalent. WWF-UK reserves the right to substitute the prize for an alternative prize of equal or greater value.



- 10. The decision of the judges is in their absolute discretion and their decision with a No correspondence will be entered into.
- 11. A representative of the entrant school submits the entry on the school behalf and by doing so accepts:
 - a) these terms and conditions
 - b) that the school and adult representatives of the school may be invited to participate in publicity arising from this competition.
